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Voters in 12 states still have primary elections for U.S. Senate

While most U.S. states already have held their primary elections, there are still 20 states with primaries between now and September, and 12 of them include races for the U.S. Senate. Maintaining and increasing the Republican majority in both chambers of Congress is the most important priority for pro-lifers this year.

Michigan's Senate race is one of the biggest battleground contests in the country because it's an open seat in a true swing state. Sen. Gary Peters, a Democrat, is not seeking re-election, creating a rare open-seat race that both parties see as critical to Senate control. Several candidates are vying for the Democratic nomination, while the Republicans are coalescing around former Rep. Mike Rogers.

New Hampshire's race is also one of the most competitive and important in the country because longtime Democratic Sen. Jeanne Shaheen is retiring, creating an open seat in a closely divided state. Several factors make the state an interesting one to watch: it has voted Democratic in recent presidential elections but often elects Republicans statewide, and it has a large bloc of independent voters. Analysts rate the state as leaning Democratic or a toss-up, but Republicans have a strong field of candidates.

The Alaska Senate race is shaping up to be another of the closely watched midterm contests because of the state's unusual election system known as ranked-choice voting. All candidates run in a non-partisan primary, with the top four - regardless of party - advancing to the general election. Incumbent Senator Dan Sullivan, a Republican elected in 2014, is running for a third term. Democrats are hoping former Rep. Mary Peltola - the first Alaska native elected to Congress - will claim the seat.

The Kansas race currently favors Republicans in a state that

has not elected a Democrat to the Senate since 1932. Sen. Roger Marshall is running for a second term. The Democrats have a crowded primary field.

The Minnesota race is shaping up to be an ideological battle within the Democrat party, with a centrist candidate facing off against a progressive one. But Republicans believe the state is competitive enough to target seriously, and several candidates are vying for the nomination.

In Virginia, Democrat Sen. Mark Warner is running for re-election and is unopposed in a primary. The Republicans vying for the nod are mostly low-profile. Term-limited Gov. Glenn Youngkin could have made the race more competitive but he decided against running.

Republican Sen. Ashley Moody, who was appointed by Gov. Ron DeSantis to finish the term of U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio, is running for a full term and while she has some primary opponents, she is expected to get the party's nomination. Primary voters will face a crowded Democratic field.

Other Senate races still to be impacted by late-season primaries include those in the reliably blue states of Delaware, Massachusetts and Rhode Island, and Republican strongholds Tennessee and Wyoming.

It is as important to vote in primary elections as it is to cast ballots in November, even in states expected to be a shoo-in for one party or the other... because it isn't only about achieving a majority of the votes, but of showing the full strength of our movement. Moreover, the more voters we mobilize in the primaries, the more prepared we are for voter mobilization in the general. Let's advance the protection of the unborn by our voting!

Pro-life and First Amendment win in U.S. Supreme Court

In a victory for the First Amendment and the pro-life movement, the U.S. Supreme Court this spring ruled unanimously in favor of a chain of pregnancy resource centers in New Jersey in their battle against the state's pro-abortion attorney general.

The case was *First Choice Women's Resource Centers vs. Davenport*.

At issue was *freedom of association*. The pregnancy centers were under attack from the pro-abortion administration in New Jersey, who issued a subpoena for their donor records. Incredibly, New Jersey claimed it wasn't harming them by doing this.

But the Court disagreed, and said that the pregnancy centers were certainly being harmed. Even just to threaten the disclosure of their donors' information discourages people from donating, thereby infringing on the donors' right to freely, and confidentially, associate themselves with the centers.

And it also therefore would hinder the centers from pursuing their mission to save lives. *In America we are free. We are free to believe in our mission, to associate together to achieve it, and in the process to be free from the interference of those in government who may disagree with us.*

That's the essence of this case and the victory we won in it.

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newspapers played a role, as did legislatures and taverns, but the moral authority and pervasive presence of the pulpit lit and sustained the thirst for liberty, and framed the fight for liberty not just as a political option, **but as a moral duty in the face of tyranny.**

The complaints listed in the Declaration of Independence regarding the tyrannical actions of the King had *been topics of preaching during the Founding Era*. Several volumes of such sermons are found in a collection edited by Ellis Sandoz, ***Political Sermons of the American Founding Era: 1730–1805***, representing preachers such as **Jonathan Mayhew, John Witherspoon, Moses Mather, Samuel West, Jonathan Edwards, Richard Price, and Noah Webster.**

The Word of God was the most common source quoted in the writings of the founding era. John Witherspoon, a signer of the Declaration, was a Presbyterian minister, and the educational background of the other founders was steeped in Biblical tradition and institutions (like Princeton) which had been founded to train clergy.

Our Founders understood Biblical teaching that government officials, like all the citizens, have duties to God and are called to live virtuously. Government must be conducted justly, must protect religious liberty, and is modeled on a covenant relationship, where duties are not just one-way, but mutual.

And the rights of the people begin with the right to life, which the Founders also understood to include the children in the womb. The tradition of common law recognized life in the womb as entitled to rights, and this only got stronger as science enabled us to understand how life in the womb developed.

As we celebrate America 250, let's recall the words preached by Jonathan Mayhew in 1750, that the Revolution was not a rebellion, "but a most righteous and glorious stand, made in defense of the natural and legal rights of the people."

And so is our political activism today. Rights come from God and must be defended, and when government fails to do that, changes must be made to restore that protection.

May this historic celebration in which we are now engaged enflame our commitment to end the tyranny of abortion and to continue to make and keep America great!

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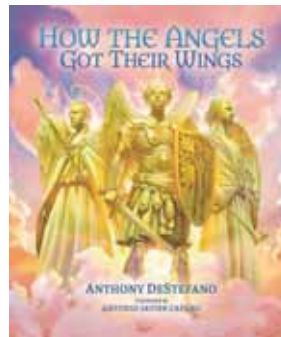
